


Author Visit for World Book Day

Batchwood Tree Planting Day

On Friday 14th March, the whole of the school took part in a tree planting day. Funded by the



Big Tree Plant scheme, the students planted 240 trees including an Elm, Beech and Oak tree to represent each of Batchwood's houses. In our new school orchard, Hertfordshire Heritage varieties of cherry, plum, apple and pear trees were planted. Students also enjoyed a break by the firepit, where they helped to cook sausages and toasted marshmallows. The former England footballer, Alan Smith and Saracens Rugby player, Chris Ashton, who are both mentors at the school, helped students plant some of the trees.

Tree Planting Day The tree plant forms part of Batchwood's bid to develop its Outdoor Curriculum; giving students as many opportunities as possible to learn outside the classroom. The students have been working alongside tree



surgeons to clear and restore a stretch of woodland along the edge of the school grounds, in order to improve wildlife habitats. They are also creating a multi-species willow plantation in which they will grow osiers for willow weaving and hybrid willows as an experiment in Bio Fuel production.

The trees planted this term will provide many more learning opportunities for Batchwood students today, and in the years to come.









Harry Potter Studios Visit

Students who had shown exemplary behaviour and attendance over the Autumn Term were rewarded with a trip to the Warner Bros. Studios, where the Harry Potter movies were filmed. Batchwood students were asked to open the doors to the Great Hall, where they found props and costumes used by the actors in the movies. They saw sets, learned about the special effects used in the movies and were able to see the models of the many magical creatures seen in the films. Some students boarded the Knight Bus, had a chance to sit in one of Ford Anglias used in filming and knocked on Harry Potter's front door at Number 4 Privet Drive.

All of the students came back to school talking about what an amazing day they had had and the staff on the trip were proud of their good behaviour.

The school had a small selection of Lego that students would often play with at breaks and lunchtimes. One of our Year 10 students enjoyed playing



with the Lego so much that he asked if the school could set up an after school Lego Club. Thanks to Friends at Batchwood, we were provided with some funds and we were able to buy some sets. The club has proved to be extremely popular and our students have been developing their social skills and having lots of fun as they build Lego together.

In March, as a reward for great team work and behaviour, the students in Lego club were taken to see The Lego Movie at the cinema.

Over the last term, students have made endless creations from Lego; some made from sets, but some have made their own creations, demonstrating both their creativity and problem-solving skills.


This "mammoth" piece of clay work can be lit internally and has taken nearly two terms to


