




Black History Month

October is recognised across the world as Black History month and this year the students at Batchwood School joined in the celebration in recognition.





Challenger Troop

Over the last 12 weeks, 8 students have participated in and completed an army influenced course. The programme has been provided by Challenger Troop whose aim is to challenge and stretch participants emotionally, physically, socially and intellectually in a safe structured environment, whilst implementing a military ethos.

Woodrow House Residential Trip

On the 19th of November, 10 students and 4 members of staff visited Woodrow house where they took part in a number of team building activities.

The pupils were split into two teams and were tasked with designing and building a catapult using only a few resources at their disposal. Each team designed unique structures in which to launch balls at a target and both made use of the clover and square hitch knots, which they learnt that morning.



The second team building

activity scheduled was to design a parachute device to stop a water balloon from bursting after being dropped from the top of Woodrow House. The final activity of the trip was the eagerly anticipated archery session where the pupils and staff were shown how to correctly and safely use a bow and arrow. The trip provided a large amount of unique opportunities for the students to participate in new challenges and the staff were all impressed with the enthusiasm shown by all.
