Waitrose Grow and Sell


This year Batchwood worked together with Waitrose in an Enterprise scheme that allowed the students to grow and sell vegetables. They thoroughly enjoyed growing the vegetables and learning how to do so. Some of the staff and students got the chance to go to the store to sell the produce they have grown. This was a very successful day. All the produce was sold and together £97 was raised. All the funds will be going towards our Outdoor Learning and Forest **School's curriculum.**





Science Experiment

On 2nd September 2015, two kilograms of rocket seed travelled to the International Space Station. The seeds have been stored in microgravity by Tim Peake before their return to Earth in the spring of 2016. All schools that participated received one red packet and one blue packet of rocket seeds each containing a minimum of 100 seeds. One contained seeds that travelled to space and the other contained ones that had remained on Earth. We were not told which seeds came from space so there was no bias.







The students sowed and grew the seeds and measured and recorded similarities or differences in plant growth between the two seed packets on the Measurement Chart. At the end of the experiment the results were entered in the national database where the findings were analysed. We were invited to make a prediction based on the evidence we gathered as to which packet contained the space seeds. We thought the blue ones came from space as they were smaller and we thought radiation or microgravity may have had an impact on growth. It was later found that the blue seeds were the ones on the space station!







Challenger Troop

Over the past term, 10 students have all taken part in the Challenger Troop course which aims to test the students and implement good self-discipline in a military setting. Although many found this difficult at first, all the students have progressed extremely well. This course has enabled the students to take part in a number of exciting activities, including, rock climbing, fire lighting, shelter building, archery, first aid and above all, teamwork. Challenger Troop is a fantastic course in which students can build self-discipline, integrity and can even earn them a Level 1/2 BTEQ by completing the course.

These students were given the opportunity to showcase these acquired skills during a residential trip to Thriftwood Scout Camp where they had to build their own shelter for the night, out of nothing more than a sheet of canvas, bungee cords and some bits of wood found on the site. The capabilities of these shelters were put to the test that night when all the elements were against them.

During the trip, each student had to use map reading skills in order to locate a pack which contained all the necessary equipment to last the night. The students were also issued a laser gun to take responsibility of. The students had to survive on army ration packs which they learnt how to prepare and cook during the term. There was many swapping of dinners and deserts until everyone got the one they wanted, except the staff of course.



During the evening, the students had to organise a patrol route to try and find the enemy camp and **capture the enemies' supplies and return them to** the camp without being eliminated. The following day, we all took part in a number of territory games.

Every student passed their first aid course and received a certificate to show their achievements as well as one to commend their completion of Challenger Troop.

Thank you to all who have helped and supported along the way and again, well done to the students. Also, a special thank you to Mr Hurley, Darcie and Robin for their continued effort on the residential trips.

First up was archery and rope swing. Archery proved

The fishermen explained how to fish correctly, showing the students the different techniques and bait to try and catch the fish. The bait consisted mainly of maggots, which can take a little getting used to if you

There were various types of fish caught on the day – Roach, Crucian Carp, Rudd, Perch and Tench. Ez and Freddie caught a huge Mirror Carp – one of the biggest the fisherman had seen in a while. The day also meant that Batchwood students got the chance to meet pupils from other schools and discuss what was going on and how they were all doing during the day. We felt extremely proud as a school when we heard that two of our pupils had broken two current records. Ez broke the current discus record, he threw 27.26m and Josh jumped 1m40cm in the high jump – both new records.

Everyone who participated received a certificate to remember the day. Everyone enjoyed the day and tried their very best.
